MINUTES READ:

Minutes from the February Council meeting were reviewed by all members of council. Amy motioned to accept the minutes and Joe B seconded the motion. All were in favor

Jeff motioned to pay the bills and Debbie seconded the motion, with all in favor.

MAYOR COMMENTS:

Mayor Degnan read the February police report – Chief Dan is preparing for an upcoming audit and has been approved for more crosswalk money. Mayor Degnan also added that the community event that they would like to have is an “End of the school year” get together in the park—they will be planning that in the next few weeks. The grant for the salt shed request will not be determined until later in 2026(September)

PUBLIC:

was present to make council aware of several street lights that are out. Mark will put together a list of lights that need “maintenance”. Debbie volunteered to call UGI to report all the “out” lights.

She also expressed interest in working on submitting a grant or gathering more information on installing sidewalks. Also mentioned the “hole”(mine shaft) that was inspected and filled in by the Department of Mining –we will contact the Department of mining to make them aware of the fact that it has reopened.

COMMITTEES:

OLD BUSINESS:

Scott from HRG Engineering reported that all the bids for the 2026 paving project were reviewed–Walter motioned to accept all the bids for the paving project with Amy seconding his motion.all were in favor. Debbie motioned to issue Notice of Intent to award the paving contract(subject to acceptable performance and payment bonds) to Stair Pavement, [Inc.in](#) the amount of \$344,315.52, Joe R seconded the motion and all members were in favor.

NEW BUSINESS:

Jeff motioned to adopt the resolution for the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update 2025 with Luzerne County,with Joe B seconding the motion. All were in favor–roll was taken)

Spring clean up dates were discussed–Amy will register and advertise the dates as Saturday, April 11th and the rain date as April 18th,

Bond permit application and excess maintenance agreement were decided with Len and Scott. \$12,500 bond for the road is required for excess weight limit on Corby Rd. Specifically for the resident building on Corby–the homeowner would be able to post the bond or the contractor(it would be their decision). A video of the road would be used for reference and kept on file by the borough. Any agreement would have to state that the homeowner/contractor would be responsible for any engineering fees involved.

Debbie motioned to adjourn, Amy seconded the motion and all were in agreement to adjourn at 7:49pm.
