MINUTES READ:

Minutes from the February Council meeting were reviewed by all members of council. Amy motioned to accept the minutes and Joe B seconded the motion. All were in favor

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The treasurer's report was read. Debbie motioned to accept the treasurer's report with Amy seconding the motion. Jeff Ford motioned to pay the bills and Joe B. seconded the motion, with all in favor.

MAYOR COMMENTS:
