### **MINUTES READ:**

Minutes from the September Council meeting were reviewed by all members of council. Joe R motioned to accept the minutes and Joe B seconded the motion. All were in favor

### **TREASURER'S REPORT:**

The treasurer's report was read, Amy motioned to accept the report and Joe R seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Jeff motioned to pay the bills for September and Amy seconded the motion. All were in favor.

### **MAYOR COMMENTS:**

Jacki read the police report from September 2024. DUI checkpoint was held in September and Chief Duffy and the police continue to contribute significant income for the borough.

### **PUBLIC:**

Donna Malak was present. She lives by the playground and her water was used to water the grass for the playground. Amy motioned to pay \$46.19 to Donna Malak for the use of her hoses and water. Joe B seconded the motion. All were in favor.

### **COMMITTEES:**

No Committees. Joe Rish mentioned he was contacted by WVSA that the website is in

compliance but there needs to be an addition of a hotline number. Joe will relay the information to Loriann and she will update the website.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

The council passed a resolution, approving a user fee of \$50.00 payable to the borough of Courtdale pursuant to 42 PA C.S.A. 1725.3 authorizing paramedics to provide assistance to law enforcement agencies to perform blood draws during a traffic violation. (ACT 142 2016)  
Joe B motioned to accept this resolution and Joe B seconded his motion, and all were in favor.

Speed limit limitations on Academy St will remain at 15MPH–SLOW markings and parking restrictions were painted on the streets to deter speed and to keep the park and street safer.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Michael Waslin's council seat status was discussed. Len agreed to call Michael and discuss his options.

Carol Zabloutney is requesting reimbursement or "help" with ink/toner for her printer. It was questioned how much she uses her printer for borough business. Amy and Jeff requested clarification on her usage.

Once the prices were discussed and reviewed, it was decided that it was too late in the season to risk sealcoating these areas. The quotes will be tabled and discussed in Spring of 2025.

Joe Rish thanked the council for the food tray that was sent because of the passing of his brother.

Police Cruiser was sold and we are in the process of completing the sale.
